Printmaking I (FA223, 3 credits) - Printmaking Track

Course Description:

An emphasis on process will be used to explore a variety of strategies to build form and convey meaning. Focus will also be on creative problem solving and professional studio techniques in Printmaking. Technical expertise appropriate to a second-year student will be developed, as well as the understanding of the relationship between form and content.

Prerequisite: Drawing II and Two-Dimensional Design II: Color

Students will:

- 1. Apply the principles of drawing and design to create works that are visually organized through various printmaking processes. (PC 1, 4)
- 2. Demonstrate basic knowledge and technical skill of a variety of printmaking techniques, tools, and languages, both current and historic. (PC 1, 2, 4)
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to use line, shape, tone, color, and composition to convey ideas and expression. (PC 3, 4)
- 4. Demonstrate unique perspectives and the evolution of ideas through critical and creative thinking. (PC 1, 2, 3, 4)
