

Residence Hall Packing List

This list is meant as a starting point for students who will be living in the 707 Residence Hall. You should consult with your roommate concerning some of these items as some things that may not need duplication (mini fridge, microwave, shower curtain, etc.). Each room contains a private bathroom as well as a regular twin bed, drafting table, stool, and a closet/wardrobe space for each resident.

Please be sure to read through both sides of this sheet, as there are helpful tips as well as items to leave at home located on the back.

HELPFUL TIPS AND INFORMATION

Renters Insurance- Should you want to protect your personal belongings, you are able to look into renters insurance for your assigned unit. Often times, your homeowner's insurance/car insurance company carry this type of insurance.

Intentional Packing- Be sure to be realistic about what you bring to campus, and what you need vs. want. Bring the basics, adjust to campus/residence hall life, and bring more as you may need it. A lot of times families bring more than is needed or used. Please do not bring a U-Haul worth of belongings, as the rooms are typically not big enough to accommodate the contents.

Clothing- You may want to consider bringing your summer/fall clothing to start, and during thanksgiving/winter break, swap out those clothes for your winter clothing to conserve space.

Micro-Fridge and Microwave- Due to the electrical system, each unit is only able to accommodate 1 Micro-Fridge and one microwave. When residents have too many items using a lot of power, it causes circuit breaker issues within the building. Please be sure to work with your roommate on who is bringing each item.

Roommate Agreement- During Move-In Weekend, your Resident Assistant will be handing out roommate agreements for you and your roommate to fill out. This is mandatory. Please start thinking about your wants and needs so you are able to have a fruitful discussion with your roommate. Some of the topics are: Communication, Cleanliness, Use of Personal Belongings, Sleep and Studio/Study Time, Guests, Personal Safety and Security, Temperature of Unit, etc.

College Approved Nails- Please DO NOT use command products on the walls to hang up decorations, as the paint has been known to peel from the removal. Instead, please use: Professional Picture Hangers, or Professional Picture Hanging Hooks.
